- Do not force an unwilling child to participate in sports.
- Remember, children are involved in organized sports for their enjoyment, not yours.
- Encourage your child to always play by the rules.
- Teach your child an honest effort is as important as a victory, so that the result of each game is accepted without undue disappointment.
- Turn defeat into victory by helping your child work toward skill improvement and good sportsmanship.
- Never ridicule or yell at your child for making a mistake or losing a competition.
- Remember, children learn best by example.
- Applaud good plays by your team and members of the opposing team.
- Do not publicly question the official's judgment and never question their honesty.
- Support all efforts to remove verbal and physical abuse from children's sporting activities.
- Recognize the value and importance of volunteer coaches and officials. They give of their time and resources to provide recreational activities for your child.
